<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Grammar, sentence structures, spelling and punctuation are almost always appropriate and accurate; any errors are likely to be slips rather than mistakes• Answers are cogent, concise and well organized through the effective use of paragraphs and/or other language markers• Vocabulary/expressions are appropriate, effective and varied; they may also be nuanced.• Attempts to rephrase the text language for inferential, rephrasing and vocabulary questions/Summary/AQ are sustained, apt and accurate.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Grammar, sentence structures, spelling AND/OR punctuation contain mistakes but they do not impede the flow of writing and meaning• Answers are organised and clearly expressed; the use of paragraphs and/or other language markers is generally effective• Vocabulary/expressions are mostly appropriate and effective; the Candidate usually writes in convincing and idiomatic English, with some positive merits.• Attempts to rephrase the text language for inferential, rephrasing and vocabulary questions/Summary/AQ are evident and sustained.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Grammar, sentence structures, spelling AND/OR punctuation contain mistakes that sometimes impede the flow of writing and meaning• Attempts at providing organised answers are evident but not always effective; the use of paragraphs and/or other language markers is absent and/or ineffective• Vocabulary/expressions have some errors but do not impeded meaning OR Only simple statements attempted successfully.• There are recognisable but limited attempts to rephrase the text language in the answers for inferential, rephrasing and vocabulary questions/Summary/AQ.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Grammar, sentence structures, spelling AND/OR punctuation contain frequent mistakes that impede the flow of writing and meaning• Answers are disorganized• Vocabulary/expressions have frequent errors that impede meaning• Answers mostly comprise wholesale copying of the text language. Any attempts to use own language for inferential, rephrasing and vocabulary questions/Summary/AQ are limited to single word expressions.
